

1st SDG: End poverty in all its forms everywhere

ENGIE internal NGOs (Energy Assistance) work to provide access to one of the basic services that is energy. They provide lighting and electricity from renewable sources to isolated populations that are far from any grid.

Beneficiaries have therefore access to new technologies, benefit from improved security at night, and are provided with the energy essential to the development of economic activities and to vital needs (cooking and education).

For instance, since 2014, ENGIE's Foundation funds the *Samusocial*'s actions in Paris for the benefit of people in extreme poverty, allowing them to find a decent place to stay and offering them medical and social support.

In addition, ENGIE's Foundation finances projects in Brazil such as Jogo Alberto, Fundação Gol de Letra.

Target:

1.4 - By 2030, ensure that all men and women, in particular the poor and the vulnerable, have equal rights to economic resources, as well as access to basic services, ownership and control over land and other forms of property, inheritance, natural resources, appropriate new technology and financial services, including microfinance



2nd SDG: End hunger, achieve food security and improved nutrition and promote sustainable agriculture

ENGIE contributes to this objective in particular through financial support, skills sponsorship and non-food donations to the French Federation of Food Banks.

In 2024, a financial donation enabled the development of social grocery stores, the purchase of hybrid or electric vehicles, cold rooms, as well as the optimization of the collection and distribution of food to guarantee maximum dietary diversity.

ENGIE also mobilizes its employees, allowing them to volunteer with the Food Banks during their working hours.

Target:

2.1 - By 2030, end hunger and ensure access by all people, in particular the poor and people in vulnerable situations, including infants, to safe, nutritious and sufficient food all year round



4th SDG: Ensure inclusive and equitable quality education and promote lifelong learning opportunities for all

The ENGIE Foundation and internal NGOs (Energy Assistance) conduct or finance humanitarian energy access projects that promote education and care for children and adults.

These projects include the electrification and maintenance of schools from pre-school to higher education, and education centers for adults who can be trained during the day or in evening classes.

For example, since 2015, the ENGIE Foundation has been supporting the association "Toutes à l'école" in Cambodia. Each year, the Foundation sponsors 100 new girls aged 5 to 6, who then pursue a high-level trilingual school curriculum (from kindergarten to high school). Once they have obtained their high school diploma, the Foundation accompanies them until their first job.

Target:

4.4 - By 2030, substantially increase the number of youth and adults who have relevant skills, including technical and vocational skills, for employment, decent jobs and entrepreneurship
